Larch area A is named for its collection of larches, also called tamaracks. These deciduous conifers define this space featuring American, European, and Japanese varieties. An elevated location over-looking our spring fed pond provides superior views of the arch bridge, Japanese crooked bridge and observation pier.

Color in these partly shaded gardens are provided by a combination of showy wooded plants, perennials and seasonal blooms. Paths surrounding the periphery of this grassy space provide easy access and quiet solitude on nearby themed benches.
